How can I become a Christian?

That is one of the most, if not THE most important questions you will ever ask!

It is not a new question, and it was even asked of Jesus himself, when he was here on earth in the flesh. In The Bible, in the book of John chapter 3, we read the story of a man by the name of Nicodemus, who came to Jesus and asked him, "How can I have eternal life?"

To which Jesus answered except you be born again, you can in no way enter the kingdom of heaven.

Nicodemus, asked "born again?" "Can I re-enter my mothers womb, and be born a second time?" Jesus said, "no Nicodemus, you must be born of the water (natural birth), and of the Spirit (the second, or re-birth). From then, until now that is the pathway to becoming a Christian, You must be born again.

So how can you get this "New Birth?" Well it's as easy as A. B. C.

A. Admit that you are a sinner. Romans 3-23 says this; "For all have sinned, and come short of Gods glory." It's true, we all have sinned, and our sin keeps us from Jesus, and out of Heaven. So we must first admit that we are indeed sinners, and that our sin, separates us from God, for He is holy, and there is no sin in Him.

B. Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ. That he is the Son of God, and that he died at Calvary, on the cross for our sins, rose from the grave on the third day, and you shall be saved. Really, it's that simple? Yes it is! For so long people have made becoming a Christian a difficult thing with many a pitfall, and drawback, but it was never intended to be such, at least not the way Jesus had planned it. See what it says here in the book of Acts; (Acts 16:30b NKJV) ... "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" (Acts 16:31 NKJV) So they said, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household."

C. Confess your need to the savior. That's it. The Apostle Paul talking to the Romans said it like this: (Rom 10:8-10 NKJV) But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

It's as easy as A. B.
